



How we SHOW Drespond to Bullying

 Nearly 1 in 3 students is involved in Bullying.

 Kids who are different are more likely to be bullied than other children.

 Boys are more likely than girls to bully others.

 Boys and girls get bullied in different ways.

If's AGAINST the Law !!

BULLYING is a CRIME!

 ASSAULT: when a person intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly causes bodily injury to another, threatens another, or causes offensive or provocative physical contact with another.

•TERRORISTIC THREAT: when a person threatens to commit any offense involving violence to any person or property

•HARASSMENT: when a person commits an offense with the intent to harass, annoy, alarm, abuse, torment, or embarrass another

• PARTY LANGUAGE: it is ALSO a crime to aid, promote, assist, and/or encourage bullying!

• What is CYBER-BULLYING exactly?

"Cyber-Bullying" is when someone uses technology, (e.g., internet, cell phones, etc.) to:

- Torment
- Threaten
- Harass or Embarrass
- Humiliate
- Target someone else

CYBER-BULLYING TIPS FOR STUDENTS

- Tell a trusted adult about the bullying, and keep telling someone until you find someone who takes action.
- Don't open or read messages from Cyber Bullies.
- Tell a teacher or administrator at your school if it is school related.
- Don't erase the messages they may be needed to take action.
- Protect yourself: Never agree to meet face to face with anyone you meet online.
- If bullied through chat or instant messaging the "bully" can often be blocked
- If you are threatened with harm, inform the local police.

REACTIONS to Bullying

How might a victim react:

- Make bad choices
- Hurt themselves
- Hurt others

STATISTICS - 10 PTS

These students are more likely to be targets of bullying.



ANSWER - 10 PTS.

Kids who are different are more likely to get bullied.





STATISTICS - 20 PTS

This ratio of students are involved in bullying.



ANSWERS - 20 PTS

Nearly 1 in 3 students is involved in bullying.





PREVENTION - 10 PTS

These people are the most effective in putting a stop to bullying.

ANSWER - 20 PTS

A bully's power comes from the attention they get, so if you don't assist, encourage, or spectate, you take away their power.





BULLYING CIRCLE _ 10 PTS

This is an excuse a bystander might give for not intervening.



ANSWER _ 10 PTS

- "I don't want to get in trouble"
- "I'm scared."
- "I don't know what to do."
- "Someone else will help out."
- "I don't have the time."
- "It's not my problem."





BULLYING CIRCLE - 20 PTS

This is an example of an appropriate response a defender can give.



ANSWERS _ 20 PTS

- Call the bully out
- Ask them to stop
- Safely protect the victim
- Safely remove the victim from the situation.

 If & when the victim is in a very dangerous situation, possibly involving life or death, restrain the bully without using violence.





CYBER BULLYING - 10 PTS

These are ways you can protect yourself against cyber bullying.



ANSWERS _ 10 PTS

- Tell a trusted adult about the bullying, and keep telling until you find someone who takes action.
- Don't open or read messages.
- Block the bully.
- If you feel threatened with harm, tell the police.





CYBER BULLYING - 20 PTS

This is why you should not delete harassing messages.



ANSWER _ 20 PTS

Because they may be needed to take legal action.





LEGAL - 10 PTS

TRUE or FALSE? Bullying is NOT a crime.



ANSWER _ 10 PTS

FALSE!! Bullying <u>IS</u> a crime!

Any form of assault, threat, or harassment of any kind is punishable by Law!





LEGAL - 20 PTS

This is the legal term for aiding, promoting, assisting, and/or encouraging bullying.



ANSWER - 20 PTS

• Party Language!

This is ALSO a crime!
You can get in legal trouble for being a look-out, cheering the bully, taking pictures/videos of the bullying, etc.
